School Safety

We advocate for safety measures for the protection of students and staff - completely supported by state funding - that meet the unique needs of campuses and communities, including flexibility to address mental health needs and student behavior.



School Funding

We advocate for a public school finance system that is adequate, equitable and supports local control.

We Support

- · Per-pupil funding at the national average
- · Adjusting the basic funding allotment each biennium based on inflation
- · Additional funding for students receiving special education services
- The same transparency, accountability standards and enrollment practices for all schools receiving state funding
- The continuation of the current defined benefit pension program for TRS members

We Oppose

- Measures that erode local discretion
- Diverting public tax dollars to privately run schools through vouchers, tax credits, taxpayer savings grants, tuition reimbursements or similar programs

Dates of Interest

- Regular Session began Tuesday, January 14, 2025 (1st day) 89th Legislature convened at noon.
- Sunday, February 2, 2025, Governor Greg Abbott announced school choice as an emergency item for the 89th Legislative Session.
- Wednesday, February 5, 2025, Senate Bill 2 (school choice) passed in the Texas Senate in a 19-12 vote. The bill will now be voted on by the Texas House.
- Tuesday, February 18, 2025 is CISD Advocacy Day at the State Capitol.



Dates of Interest

- Friday, March 14, 2025 (60th day) 60-day deadline for bill filing.
- Monday, June 2, 2025 (140th day) Sine die. (Last day of 89th Regular Session)
