No. 8691 Discussion of Districtwide Intruder Detection Audit Report Findings

The Texas School Safety Center recently conducted an Intruder Detection Audit at one or more of our campuses. The state gives school districts 45 days from official notification to enact corrective actions and we took immediate action as a response to the findings. While we are not releasing any sensitive details to the public regarding the audit in open session, a corrective action plan was put into place due to the findings. This audit is conducted as part of Governor Abbott's school safety directives for all school systems to help school districts identify how campuses can improve safety for our children and staff, such as ensuring exterior doors are locked. The audit provides Crowley ISD with an opportunity to create a safer learning environment and is just one of the many actions that we are taking to ensure that our schools are safe.

Future Action Item(s)

Targeted Improvement Plan for Mary Harris Elementary School and District Improvement Plan

The CISD Administration presented a Targeted Improvement Plan for Mary Harris Elementary School and the District Improvement Plan for Board approval during the month of February. Board approval and oversight are essential for ensuring that the targeted improvement plan aligns with district priorities and legal requirements. This item will be brought back for consideration and possible action during a future board meeting.

2023-2024 Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR) Public Hearing

The Texas Academic Performance Reports (TAPR) pull together a wide range of information on the performance of students in each school and district in Texas every year. Performance is shown disaggregated by student groups, including ethnicity and socioeconomic status. The reports also provide information on school and district staff, programs and student demographics. Information from the 2023-2024 Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR) and other requirements from TEA will be available after the public hearing.

RFP-050-2024-2025 Kitchen Equipment for Deer Creek ES, Meadowcreek ES and Sycamore ES

This RFP ran from 12/18/24 to 1/8/25. The purpose is to replace existing equipment using funds from the child nutrition account. This item will be brought back for consideration and possible action during a future board meeting.

RFP-051-2025-00 Styrofoam Recycle Units – Elementary Use

Crowley ISD is receiving RFP's (Request for Proposals) for vendors that can supply the district with Styrofoam recycle units that will be utilized at 17 campus locations within Crowley ISD premises. Examples of recycling styrofoam units are StyroGenie, Styrofoam Compactor, Styrofoam Densifier or any company approved equal recycling unit. The purpose of this RFP is for Crowley ISD schools to become more environmentally friendly with disposing Styrofoam while reducing waste usage. This item will be brought back for consideration and possible action during a future board meeting.
